Dear Sir

With reference to the enclosed notice, and a reading of the Proponent's "concept" for a Terminal at White's point, it appears to me that this six hundred foot projection into the Bay of Fundy will create a serious hindrance and handicap for those who need free way at all times up and down these inner coastal waters in the exercise of their particular fishery and when seeking the most direct course out of a threatening storm.

Some of the fisheries directly impacted include lobster, herring (seiner and weir), ground fish (handliner) penwinkle and other.

Whale watching and other eco-tourism businesses, recreation activities, e.g. sea-kayaking, diving, canoeing etc, would also suffer from loss of free way up and down these coastal waters.

The proposed terminal would undoubtedly create a serious obstruction and hazard in these currently navigated waters and should not be built.
