Kamloops' unemployment rate rises

Jump in May to 7.4% from 5.5% due in part to more job seekers

By Cam Fortems STATE KERORITER

The city's jobless picture worsened in May, in part because more people are look ing for work.

Statistic Canada's labourtorce survey, released on Friday, June 6, pegged the anemployment rate in May at 7.4 per cent in Kamboops. which is up from 5.5 per cent. in May 2013.

In the Thompson-Okanagan region, the cate fell to 6.6 percent from seven per cent a Stat ago.

But, the number of people either working or horking for work in Kamboops is up from last year, a sign of optimism in the comonly. It also reflects the fact audents are looking for john.

Canada's intempleyment rate edged back to seven per cent after several months

at 6.9 per cent, an unusual outcome caused by more Canadams entering the work

However, the real news in the key monthly report from Statistics Canada is that full-time carpleyment fell by 29,140, the second big drop in two months.

The dollar weakened modextly on the news, particularly as it compared to a relatively suonger 217,000 job-cremisti month in the United States.
